Handicapping Workshops - 2018

To be held at Cheltenham CC on 11th March and Budleigh Salterton CC on 16th March.

Why are Club Handicappers Essential?

Just as the purpose of handicaps is to ensure fairness, the purpose of every club having a Club Handicapper is to ensure consistency. There is nothing new here but we are aware that smaller clubs in particular struggle to find someone with the confidence and experience to take on this role and new clubs may possibly be unaware of the need for a handicapper altogether.

In order for games and matches to be fair, it is essential that all players have a handicap that is correct.

- For those who play <u>regularly</u> against other clubs, their handicaps are usually, but not always right.
- For those who play regularly **but only with the occasional outside match**, their handicaps will almost certainly be wrong and by definition, unfair.
- Players new to the game often improve quickly once they have learnt the tactics and this is where their handicap does not reflect their improved ability. It is not the fault of the player but of the club and the club handicapper is expected to notice and correct handicaps before their members play in matches.

What about clubs where there is no-one with sufficient confidence to take on this role?

- This is not an unusual situation and everyone wants to support new clubs. We were all anxious when we started and the aim of the meeting will be to help, inform and encourage.
- No Club Handicapper should ever feel they are on their own.

What is the purpose and format of the Handicapping Workshop?

• The purpose is to learn from existing handicappers, exchange views and examples of good practice, be reassured that there is consistency throughout the federation and to encourage others to become club handicappers.

All will be explained, such as:

- Why handicaps are sometimes wrong;
- What a Club Handicapper needs to know and needs to do.
- The on-going help, advice and encouragement that the Federation and other clubs will give in order to guide and support those who are new to the role of Club Handicapper.



Will I be a Club Handicapper at the end of this conference?

- Attendance at this workshop will not qualify you as a Club Handicapper your club appoints one of its members to that position.
- However, those attending will receive a certificate of attendance which club committees may consider a valuable piece of evidence.
- For those who have little or no previous experience, it will take more than attendance at a one-day workshop to become competent in assessing handicaps and administering the system.
- That is why we will be pairing clubs and handicappers to ensure everyone is fully supported in developing knowledge, experience and confidence.

We invite and urge every club to send two or more delegates.

- It would be good to see existing handicappers, those new to handicapping, delegates from clubs who do not currently have a handicapper, and league captains.
- This will ensure discussion can continue when they are back at the club and perhaps encourage the appointment of two club handicappers, one for GC and one for AC.
- In order to encourage as many clubs as possible to attend we are holding two identical workshops, one at each end of the federation. This will also make the numbers attending small enough to encourage discussion in a non-intimidating atmosphere.
- At the workshop, you will meet Club Handicappers and CA Handicappers for both GC and AC.

Further information will be sent to all clubs in February.

Each of the short life working groups has now met and has a set of tasks to work on - you may be hearing from them direct or through us for ideas and suggestions so do please respond to these.



CA Diplomas recognise those club members who have given outstanding service to croquet and have been active in club or federation affairs over a long period. The Diplomas have nothing to do with croquet prowess and everything to do with help given to other members.

Nomination should be accompanied by a short citation, signed by a club official, and sent to the CA Office by the end of July. In the past, diplomas have been awarded to club members from both large and small clubs in the SWF area.

The SWF area celebrated the presentation of the CA Diploma award to Mo Boys of Camerton and Peasedown this year - she was delighted to be awarded this and C&P note that it is a lovely way of appreciating someone's contribution to a Club over a number of years.

The South West Croquet Academy (SWCA) at Budleigh Salterton CC

For 2018, the SWCA is continuing to offer a wide range of courses that offer something for everyone. In addition to a range of AC and GC courses, there are a number of new courses for coaches, referees and Short Croquet players

The Two Coaches Courses will be led by Dave Kibble. These are for players wanting to gain their first coaching badge at Club Coach level (AC or GC), and a course for players wanting to gain their Grade 1 coaching badge (AC or GC).

This latter course will appeal to existing Club Coaches, as well as suitable players who have already established themselves at club coaching level but who may not have a formal qualification.

For players interested in becoming Referees, the SWCA is particularly pleased to have top Examining & Championship Referees Dr Ian Vincent and Marcus Evans leading courses for AC and GC respectively. These courses are also suitable for players who are not yet ready to become referees, but who would like to gain a deeper knowledge of AC Laws or GC Rules.

There has been a great upsurge recently in **Short Croquet** so, recognising this and the fully subscribed SC Tournaments in the south West, the SWCA felt it was time to introduce a course for Short Croquet enthusiasts. This course is led by Stephen Custance-Baker, one of the leading exponents of the game.

Stephen is also one of the foremost GC players and coaches in the South West, and will be leading several **GC courses** at the SWCA in 2018.

For AC players, the outstanding response in 2017 to the two innovative courses led by Roger Mills for Improvers and Mastering the 4 ball/3 ball break, has convinced the SWCA to repeat these courses in 2018. Both these courses will be run over 2 separate days to give you time to practice what you learn on Day 1 (25 April - shot skills & the 4 ball break) before going on to further enhance your skills and tactics on Day 2 of the course (20 May - tactics for building & maintaining breaks). Each day is fairly intensive, but there is a comprehensive reference pack and practice guide to help you after the course.

So there it is! A wide-ranging programme for 2018, which offers something for everyone. Judging by the extremely high feedback ratings awarded by delegates on this year's SWCA courses, they clearly had an enjoyable time developing their game - and this is what we are offering for 2018.
